I will be travelling with Julie and a team of 45 medical workers on a mission trip to Guatemala. We will be gone from Friday, January 22nd through Saturday, January 30th, serving with *Faith in Practice*, a medical mission that we worked with while living in Houston. *Faith in Practice* is committed to serving the poor of Guatemala through short-term medical mission trips that take an integrated approach to care that strives to reach those in the greatest need. Each year, more than 1,200 medical professionals and support personnel from across the United States and world travel to Guatemala, paying their own direct expenses to serve the poor. *Faith in Practice* teams see more than 25,000 patients annually. A typical day for our team might involve seeing 360 patients, 145 of them in paediatrics, 74 in gynaecology, 45 in dermatology, 66 in VIA Cryo, which screens for cervical cancer, 98 dental patients, with 179 tooth extractions. Two years ago over the course of four days our lab team performed 127 urine analyses and handed out some 400 pairs of reading glasses. Our totals for each day were: Monday, 528; Tuesday, 629; Wednesday, 639; Thursday: 805, a total of 2601 patients in four days. Three hundred thirty people were referred to surgeries that took place over the next several months as surgery teams from all over the United States came to Guatemala and worked in the hospitals.

The totals are impressive, but the personal stories touch our lives in ways numbers cannot. A young girl was diagnosed with a spinal condition that was affecting her ability to walk. She began to have signs of this disease as an eight year old. We met her when she was eleven years of age. By then she could no longer walk. Sadly, there was no healing for her. All we could do was supply her with a walker. This beautiful little girl gamely made her way around the clinic...smiling.

The next morning we were preparing to go to our clinic when one of our dentists pulled me aside. She had travelled from Wichita Falls, Texas, and in telling some of her friends about the mission trip she was doing, someone gave her a Spanish language Bible. They said, "Find the right person and give them this Bible." Because our dentist friend, Dr. Tina, was in clinic all day, she handed me the Bible and said, "Find just the right person." Watching the little girl with her walker, facing a lifetime of challenges, and smiling through it all, I knew who the right person was. I went in the dental clinic, waited for Tina to extract yet another tooth, and then told her to come with me. We found the little girl, whose name is Evelyn. We told her we had been sent with a special gift for a very special person, and that we felt like she was the person we should give the gift to. Tina took the Bible, placed it in the small hands of Evelyn, and we prayed for her. Even though we were not able to heal her body that day, something felt right about giving her a story that promises a healing not only for little girls with walkers but for all of God's precious children, a story that tells of a God whose love is so great He would send His only Son to save this world. I hope and pray, and I firmly believe, when this little girl named Evelyn opens that Bible, she will come to know the God whose love is so wide and deep that it reaches to Guatemala and to the ends of the earth.

Thanks for your prayers and support as we go on this mission trip. You can be assured we will give a full report when we return.


Per Capita

Then on Christmas Day something happened, and it was not about Sally anymore. It was about the people who came to gather together either for Worship or to have dinner or both. Some who came to dinner were hungry, some would have been unable to gather as a family without our venue, some would have been alone on Christmas Day, some came to help, and others came for reasons I do not know. So after the brief period of freaking out, I had one of my best Christmases in years. I had a chance to experience the joy that is ours when we are given a glimpse into the person God wants us to be, and for that I am very grateful.

I also had the opportunity to sit with Sally on Christmas afternoon and show her the pictures from the day, and she was proud of all of us who had a hand in keeping her vision going. It made her cry, but they were happy tears.

Thank you to those who wanted to give me their cell phone number in case I needed it on Christmas Day. Thank you to those who came to serve. Thank you, Sally, for being the start of something bigger than you or me. Thank you, Lord Jesus Christ, for Your blessings at Christmas then and now.
