
Mother's Day Breakfast





May is also a month with two days that recognize the sacrifices of the men and women who have served or are still serving in the military to provide all of us with security in a world where evil doers seem intent on bringing destruction and terror to our doorstep. May 21st is Armed Forces Day and May 30th is Memorial Day.

The Mission Committee recently sent a donation to help with a problem at the VAMC-Providence. Some people know that I am on the voluntary services committee at the VA Hospital in Providence as the representative for the American Legion Auxiliary for the state of Rhode Island. In March, I brought a pressing concern from the VAVS meeting to the Mission Committee at DCCCP. The Volunteer Services committee provides transportation to veteran patients from the parking lots to the hospital entrance with two golf carts. The two used carts we had both became unrepairable in December. If you have ever been to the VAMC in Providence, you know it is located at the top of a very steep hill and that parking is a huge problem. The overflow lots are located half way down the hill and at the base of the hill, leaving veterans to struggle up the hill on foot, in the absence of the golf carts. The VA was supposed to construct a parking garage four years ago; however, after the scandals of veterans waiting months for appointments for serious illnesses, all funds were diverted to increase the medical staff and improving care.

The Masons of Rhode Island donated the cost for one new cart and the DCCCP Mission Committee voted \$4000 to match the funds raised by the Voluntary Services committee to purchase the second new cart. Abraham Lincoln stated more than 150 years ago that it is the responsibility of all of the country to “care for those who have borne the battle,” and we believe that we have contributed to caring for our Rhode Island veterans.
