If we give thanks in the dead of winter or in high summer, as the spring flowers blossom or the leaves drop in the fall, we are always ready for thanksgiving.

I am writing this article from my desk in our home, and scattered on the desk are numerous thank you notes that kind people have sent our way. Jason and Heather came to visit us this summer. Jason is now an officer with the Sacramento Police Department and doing an outstanding job in law enforcement and community building. Heather has worked with youth groups and they have three beautiful children, two of them already grown and in their own careers. They took time from a visit to Boston to ride the train to Westerly and spend the night with us. I officiated at their wedding in 1989, and these two are dear and beloved friends. Along with lots of hugs and sharing of familiar stories, Jason at one point handed us this thank you note. We laughed and laughed. But later I placed it in a prized spot on my desk, a spot I will see over and over again, each and every time I sit at my desk.



And most of all let us thank God for the gift of life and the blessing of His love.

Cheese, Bacon, and Onion Quiche

1 single crust pie shell unbaked
6 slices of bacon, cut into 2-inch pieces
1 small onion, chopped
3 eggs
½ cup milk
½ cup heavy cream
1 cup shredded Swiss cheese
½ teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper

- Line 8 inch quiche or pie pan with pastry.
- Cook bacon until crisp.
- Drain and place in pie shell.
- Sauté onion in bacon fat until lightly browned.
- Drain off fat, turn heat off and stir in eggs, milk, cream, cheese, and seasonings.
- Pour into pastry-lined pan.
- Bake in preheated 375 degree oven for 25 minutes or until knife inserted in custard comes out clean.
- Serve hot, warm, or cold.


Easy Garden Vegetable Pie

1 (10oz.) pkg frozen chopped broccoli or 2 cups fresh
½ cup chopped onion
½ cup chopped green pepper
1 cup grated cheddar cheese
1 ½ cups of milk
¾ cup Bisquick
3 eggs
1 tsp. salt
¼ tsp pepper

- Heat oven to 400 degrees.
- Lightly grease pie pan.
- Mix broccoli, onion, green pepper and cheese in pie pan.
- Beat remaining ingredients until smooth.
- Pour mixture into pie plate.
- Bake until golden brown. (35-40 min.)



What is The Family Housing Support all about?

Helping Families with Children

It all started when a group of concerned citizens came together in June of 2013 to learn more about a growing problem in our community. Although we have resources to assist homeless individuals in our area, there are very few emergency housing options for families with *children*. In our community there are families with children living out of their cars, in campgrounds or in hotels. The Family Housing Support Project has been created as a grass roots effort to give these families a temporary place to land while they get the assistance they need.

Where have we been and where are we now?

In January 2014 we secured our first apartment and with the help of the community it was furnished and ready for our first family. A week later a single mom with two children moved in and also receives the wrap around social services from the Warm Center. After four months our first family had moved onto "non-emergency" housing and continues to receive the wrap around services. They are doing well and getting back on their feet. The apartment is prepared for the next family. In April 2014 the second family had moved in and in August the third family. Additionally, in September 2014 we secured our second apartment that can hold a larger family. A family moved into this apartment and the cycle continues. In June of 2013 we secured a third apartment to reach even more in need. It is now mid-2017 and we have helped over 17 Families and 33 Children! We continue to raise funds to support the three apartments and the need is great as there are many families looking for help.

To date we have assisted over 17 families and 33 children!

Each apartment w/ full wrap around social services requires \$20,000 for a year. There are many families in need of emergency housing that are currently on a "waitlist" to receive this assistance. Where are they now? They are living in hotels, staying with family or friends, or in some cases living out of their vehicles. During the warmer weather these families will also stay in the woods and in campgrounds. This is no place for a child to call home. Please help us to help the children of our local area. **How can you HELP?**



The WARM Center's Dollar-Makes-a-Difference Campaign offers a way for the community to support their neighbors who are in need of heating assistance. It starts in October and runs for 22 weeks into March. The concept is simply. If everyone could give a dollar for 22 weeks, WARM Center would be able to help dozens of local families who are without heat. Folks are more than welcome to write a check to the WARM Center (specifying the Dollar-Makes-a-Difference Campaign on the memo line) in the amount of \$22 that covers the entire heating season...or give what you can. Every dollar truly does make a difference.

A lack of heat can have troubling effects: research has shown that children in homes which lack heat are more likely to suffer from anxiety; are unable to study and achieve educational benchmarks, and households struggling to maintain warmth in their homes are more likely to suffer incidences of domestic violence. The 2017 Kids Count Report cites Rhode Island as leading the other New England states in the highest poverty rate for children: 19%. Even households who qualify for the Low Income Heating Assistance Program often wait months for their voucher. Often, the vouchers are not received until January—long after the heat needs to come on in the New England fall and winter.

Every penny of the Dollar-Makes-a-Difference Campaign goes directly to heating assistance for local residents. And this has been critical to hundreds of families over the years who know their home is warm—and it often means they are not faced with the decision of choosing between paying rent or buying fuel oil; repairing a car so they can get to work or buying fuel oil, buying food or prescriptions or buying fuel oil.
