Pledge Update



Thank you to all who have pledged a donation for the 2019 budget. We are blessed to have such a generous congregation of faithful givers.

Your pledge gives the Trustees and Session an estimate of next year's income. As of November 14th, we have received pledges from 92 households. The total amount pledged is \$209,710 toward our goal of \$262,650 in pledged income. We are currently short of our goal by \$52,940.

As the 2019 budget is considered, we are hoping for additional pledges to feel certain that our spending will not exceed our giving. If you have not turned in a pledge card, they are available in the Church pew racks or in the Church Office. Please put it in the offering plate, mail it, or drop it off in the Church Office.

All pledges are appreciated and bring us closer to our budget goals! On behalf of the leaders of the Church, THANK YOU to all who have so generously pledged and given donations.

Helpful Tax Tips

With the various changes to income tax laws, you may want to pay next year's pledge to the Church by the end of THIS year (2018). This way your gift will be deductible on this year's income tax return. We can credit your donation to your 2019 pledge. Just write "2019 Pledge" on your payment. As with all tax issues, you should check with your tax advisor first.

If you have appreciated common stock in your investment portfolio that you have held for more than 12 months, you may transfer that stock directly to the Church instead of selling it. You may avoid paying the capital gains tax, possibly resulting in Federal and State Income Tax savings. Consult with your tax advisor before making any decisions. If you wish to make a transfer, our Office Manager, Luba Preble, can give you more information.

If you are retired and are at least 70½ years old, you may be receiving a "Required Minimum Distribution" (RMD) from your "Individual Retirement Account" (IRA). Consider using part of your RMD as a charitable contribution. The RMD will not be taxed as individual income, but the distribution will satisfy the required minimum distribution rule. **Note:** You will not be able to take a deduction for a charitable donation. Contact your IRA representative for more information.

Per Capita

The Per Capita payment for **2019** will be **\$50.05** per Church member, or \$100.10 per couple.

Per capita pays for the expenses of the national and regional governing bodies of the Church. Local churches are charged a fee for each of their members every year. If individual members do not donate this fee, the money comes out of the Church's General Fund budget.

Each Church member is kindly asked to pay this \$50.05 fee. If you use offering envelopes, you will find an envelope marked "per capita." If not, you may place your payment in the offering plate. Please make your checks payable to DCCCP and write "per capita" on the memo line.

The Session and Trustees thank you for helping to support our Church.
