The Session welcomed Rev. Joan Priest as moderator, beginning her renewed ministry with us. We continue to make progress as we transition. Elders Bruce Yarnall and Art Ganz met with General Presbyter Shannon Vance-Campo, as we are learning

more of the process of new pastor selection. Although we are ready and rearing to go ahead, Presbytery wants us to let Rev. Joan be established and completion of our Mission Report before we move ahead. Currently our Church Mission Report (church information for potential candidates) is being prepared. The last piece of this is completion of our congregational survey which has begun. Surveys are available each Sunday for everyone to complete or stop by the church office during business hours. Those not responding will be sent an electronic version. The sooner we complete this it can go for processing. So far almost ½ of the congregation has responded.

The Mission Committee reports that \$2500 was collected from the concert proceeds and Stop & Shop fundraiser for Habitat for Humanity. The Easter offering will go to Partners for World Health and for the next group of refugees from Dorcas International.

The plans for Holy Week worship are made and will be reported separately; Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter services.

The Tuesday dinners are a huge success. Volunteers for hosting the dinners are needed to keep this ministry going forward.

Speaking of volunteers... Amanda needs one or more adults to help with Sunday morning children's programs. To secure safety we need, at least, a second adult present. Our children's ministry is top priority as we try to rebuild our Sunday school after Covid. Please help, it is also nice to give the parents time to worship. So come on folks! Helping with kids is fun and keeps you young!

We will be going on our annual trip to the Gulf in April, so wishing everyone a safe and Happy Easter. By the time we get back will have our third grandchild.

Nominating Committee update:

We wanted to let the congregation know about the Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC) process.

In order for us to go ahead and call a PNC, we need to have the ok from the Presbytery, specifically the Committee on Ministry (COM). The first step in this process is to update our Mission Statement. Fortunately, the previous Mission Statement created when Rev. Glenn retired, still accurately reflects our congregation. It just needs updating which the Session is doing. Part of the Mission Statement is the results of the survey which was given to church members in mid-March. Once the data has been

analyzed, added to the report, and the Mission Statement approved, it will be forwarded to the COM.

The COM will approve it and hopefully give us the okay to call a PNC.

Unfortunately, the COM meets on the second Wednesday of each month. So if the Mission Statement is approved by session and sent to the COM on April 14th, they will not look at it to approve it as a committee until May 10th. Frustrating, yes, but there is not much we can do about when they meet.

The makeup of the PNC has to follow certain parameters. For example, we must have a deacon, a trustee and an elder on the PNC. The other members must not be board members and no husband-and-wife teams are allowed. It is also frowned upon to have employees on the PNC.

Church Partner Feature

We have many truly wonderful churches that partner with us, and we wanted to highlight on of those amazing partners!

In February Dunn's Corners Community Church Presbyterian hosted three days of fundraising for South County Habitat for Humanity. Their fundraising efforts involved setting up a table outside of the Westerly Stop & Shop (braving the cold temperatures) to talk to shoppers about our mission, hosting an informational table at their Sunday services, and then an incredible evening of music by the Narragansett Bay Chorus where there was a good-will offering in our honor. Between the three fundraising initiatives, the church raised more than \$2,500 for our mission! Incredible! Thank you!

Easter Mission Offering



This year our Easter Mission Offering will be divided between two worthy causes. Part of the offering will be given to *Partners for World Health*, a non-profit 501(c)3 based in Portland, Maine. PWH collects medical supplies and equipment from healthcare facilities and manufacturers that would otherwise be thrown away. They sort, evaluate, repackage, and prepare these supplies and equipment for distribution to individuals, communities, and healthcare facilities in need. Since 2009, PWH has collected more than 5 million pounds of medical supplies that otherwise would have been destined for local landfills. In addition to their other work in America and around the world, they are currently supplying emergency workers in Syria and Turkey after the earthquake devastation.

The remainder of the offering will be used to purchase supplies for the next refugee family that we help to get settled. We have been working with Dorcas International who provides family literacy and adult education, employment services, refugee resettlement, translating and interpreting, citizenship and immigration services, and more to vulnerable populations in the Providence area. They also find apartments for newly arrived refugees, and ask churches and other volunteers to provide the furnishings for the apartment. We helped two families last year, and another this past January. We hope to help one or two more families this year, using the proceeds of the Easter Offering. The Mission committee team will purchase the necessary household items (dishes, towels, sheets, blankets, curtains, etc). and will bring them to the apartment, where the team will clean, set -up and leave the supplies.
