Nominating Committee Update:

As Rev. Priest is now our interim minister, we are one step closer to calling a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). There are guidelines the Nominating Committee has to follow. Presbytery guidelines are as follows: the PNC should be composed of 7 to 11 members of the church (our goal is to have 9 members), a deacon, an elder and a trustee and one youth (if possible) high school age or older, only one person per household or extended family can serve on the PNC (i.e. spouses cannot both serve on the committee) and the previous PNC cannot simply be replicated.

The reading program in The Early Learning Center is ongoing. Judy Nichipor organized this program and suggested a variety of books while volunteers chose their favorite to share.




Children who are Baptized in our church receive a book as a gift from the Women's Group to commemorate the occasion and to further promote reading at an early age.
