And we have set our dates for 2024 already. Our large yellow sign has been attracting visitors and this year I put a larger ad in the Westerly "things to do" section promoting the show. We do have flyers that we post in local libraries and Post Offices, but we need to do a better job on that next year. Sew, what's new? We have learned that the women of the Chikumbuso Project would prefer to wear a skirt and T-shirt instead of the sundresses the younger girls wear. We can easily start making skirts in the new year, but we will need to do some kind of fundraising to purchase T-shirts. We recently spent \$430 for bias tape for sundress straps, and we will be needing to purchase batting for our quilts in 2024. Needless to say we have been using up a lot of products! Right now I am thinking of having a dollar donation container in Fellowship Hall each Sunday. If you have some change or a real dollar bill (who carries cash anymore??) to put in the container we may have a good start to be able to purchase T-shirts in 2024.

At the August meeting we began a series of discussions regarding how to address a changing church. During this time of transition, we need to look at where we are today and where the church needs to adjust to community in a changing society. First there needs to be a church profile developed describing who we are to prospective clergy, finances of what we can afford to pay for salary and housing and finally the review of resumes of candidates. This coming year we look forward to two concerts. Shoreline Ringers under the direction of Maestro Andy Wallace will return. Congratulations to Andy! Also, a male chorus called the Barn Stormers will be scheduled.

Stewardship campaign will begin. This year will be more challenging in that our church donations are down and we are experiencing a cash flow problem. During this time of transition our need will be greater. One big hurdle we will face calling a new pastor will be the cost of affordable housing in this area.

So lets all pitch in to make this coming season the best yet. AG




