

This month's agenda focused on the review of the 2024 budget. We are currently facing a projected \$43,000 deficit in the 2024 budget. Much discussion took place over using some of our Reserve Funds to help cover some programs for 2024 and a discussion regarding the staff took place. Eventually the Session agreed to delay approval for one month to see if more income from pledges comes in.

The pastoral Nominating Committee continues to make progress. Our financial out-look and the cost of housing are challenging for the committee, as they review potential candidates.

After a lot of hard work the Compliance Committee presented a child protection policy which was approved by Session. So far DCCCP has (Presbytery) approved policies for child and youth protection, sexual misconduct, and harassment. A racial discrimination policy is needed, and we are waiting for guidance from Presbytery for the verbiage. Plans for Advent are underway. Joan will offer a "Blue Christmas" service on December 21, for those suffering loss and depression over the holidays.

## **PNC Update**

The days are shortening and the holidays are approaching and your Pastor Nominating Committee remains hard at work. We continue to meet at a minimum of once a week and more often as needed. We recently conducted our first initial interview, have another scheduled and have others under consideration. We also continue to get matches through the Church Leadership Connection and those must also be evaluated before we can decide whether or not to invite them to apply.

As a real estate agent, I like the home buying analogy: you find out basic information about a house online and decide if you want to look at it. Then you have a first showing and you decide if you are still interested. If you are, you go back and look again to explore those details you missed. If it's not a fit, you move on to another house. Most importantly, you keep looking and wait for the house that is the right fit for you. So, as we go through this process, we are doing our best to find that right fit for us.

## Stewardship Update

Thank you to everyone who pledged. A total of 88 families pledged a total of \$253,957. Your generosity is appreciated and your gifts will be used wisely.



Thank you also to Bob and Sue Strouse who helped a great deal with this Stewardship campaign. They provided invaluable help to create this year's pledge drive.

Unfortunately, the amount pledged is less than last year's \$264,000 and this leaves us with a budget shortfall of approximately \$43,000 for 2024 if we continue to fund the church at the same level. The 2024 budget includes a one time expense of \$25,000 in order to call a new pastor. This is one of the primary reasons our budget is higher this year than normal as we will need money to help transition a new pastor to our church.

It is vital that we can provide the strongest possible financial status for a prospective pastor. We are a strong, community center church and we want to continue that into the future.

We are asking for everyone to reconsider their pledge amount, consider pledging if you haven't already done so, or give a one time gift to help get us through this time of transition.

## **Christmas Mission Offering Envelopes**



The offerings collected in the special **Christmas Mission Offering Envelopes** will support the local food pantries including: JonnyCake Center, Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center, Pantry on the Lane, RI Can and the Warm Shelter.

As you might imagine, the need is greater this year than we've ever seen before due to the high cost of food and the recent reduction in SNAP benefits.

Some statistics that help demonstrate the need come to us from the JonnyCake Center of Westerly:

"Our biggest food drive, Boy Scout Drive, went well. We are so thankful for all the efforts of the Boy Scouts! However, we received about 1/3 less than last year's donation. This year we received 5,500 lbs. vs. 8,500 lbs. last year. Last year's donation lasted into March of the 2023; this year our best guess is it will last thru December.

"We are seeing more new clients than ever before. Last year, we would see 1 or 2 new clients/week. Recently we have been seeing new clients almost every day, 3 - 10/week.

"This year we will support 430 families for food and gifts for Christmas."

The monetary donations that JohnnyCake Center and the other food pantries receive from the **Christmas Mission Envelopes** will help offset the reduced donations they have received this year and the increase in the number of clients they support.


## Christmas Eve

## Mission

In November, Joan asked the Mission Committee to help Patricia, the lovely woman from Jamaica who has been worshipping with us and singing with the choir the past few months while she was working at the Ocean House. Her work was ending and she was returning to Jamaica. Food and clothing are very expensive there, and Patricia was distressed because she was not able to make the money she had hoped for.

Patricia asked Joan for help for her family and her community. The Mission committee took Patricia for a massive 4hr shopping trip to Burlington and BJ's in New London to buy food and clothing. We drove it to a shipper in Bridgeport, who sold us two large blue plastic barrels and helped us prepare it for shipment.

We shipped a 50 lb bag of rice, 20 lbs each of sugar and flour, many, many cans of soup, vegetables, spam, sausages, boxes of crackers, tea and cereal, plus countless shirts and pants, soap and shampoo. **The Pastor's Discretionary Fund** paid for everything.

What a great pleasure it was to do this! It felt like Christmas! Patricia is very sweet and very, very grateful to the church. She cried with relief. God is good! So is our church!
