



Lenten Book and Bible Study:

<u>A Time to Grow: Lenten Lessons from the Garden to the Table</u> by Kara Eidson **Tuesday's at 9:30 a.m.** in the Fellowship Hall beginning **February 13** and continuing until March 26.

She writes, "The inspiration for this Lenten resource comes from two of my greatest passions, faith and food – particularly, the growing and tending of my own food. When I am in the garden with my hands in the earth, I feel deeply connected to creation, and thereby more connected to God, our Creator".

The theme for each week will guide us through the elements of the garden: soil, order, life, water, light, restoration, time, remember, fast, and feast. Each lesson also contains the scripture passages we will be exploring on Sunday mornings as well. Consider this your personal invitation on a journey from seed to table – your invitation to pull up a chair at God's heavenly feast.

Join us on Tuesdays when you can. Or purchase a book to read on your own. Each section includes brief daily devotionals for each of the forty days during the Lenten season. Cost of the book is \$10.



Condition of the front door is being addressed, with a replacement cost of \$11,000 -\$15,000. Money is budgeted, but due to our overall projected financial deficient we are asking for a special request for donations to off-set the cost.

The Mission Committee is very busy with several projects moving ahead. This year's Easter Offering will go to help homeless veterans. Dorcas is housing another refugee family and asks for donation of home goods to help in the settlement. A similar request is made from Habitat for Humanity to assist families when moving into their habitat homes.

Tuesday Night Dinners will resume during Lent with a vesper service and children's activities. Session will host the first dinner.

Session authorized two congregational meetings; one for January 28 for election of a Trustee and the Annual Meeting scheduled for February 18 following the 10 o'clock worship.



MISSION COMMITTEE REPORT

Another Mission family...

The Mission committee will be helping another refugee family in February. We will share more about our new family soon. Dorcas International, the organization we work with, will provide the furniture for the family's apartment. The Church Mission budget will be used to purchase sheets, towels, dishes, cleaning supplies and everything else necessary for a refugee family which has lost almost everything but the clothes they bring.

During one day in February, the Mission committee will prepare the apartment with all the furnishings, and will spend the day cleaning, putting up curtains, making beds, putting away dishes and anything else needed. We invite you to join us for the day! (Note: A few flights of stairs are usually involved.)

Christmas offering news

Thank you for your generous contributions to the Christmas Mission offering. It was a wonderful success!

With your help, and some additiional money from our annual Mission budget, we were able to give \$8,000 to help the problem of food insecurity. The money was divided between The Jonnycake Center, Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center, RI Center Assisting those in Need (RICAN), The WARM Shelter and the Bradford Pantry on the Lane.

We also supported the work of South County Habitat for Humanity with another \$1,000 gift. Thank you and bless you for your gracious generosity.

"OUR DOORS ARE ALWAYS OPEN"

As you have passed through our entrance on countless Sunday mornings, you may have noticed our main entry doors are in less than good condition. This will improve the front entryway's appearance and just as importantly, its security.

The cost is anticipated to be \$12,000 to \$14,000 which does put a strain on our *already* strained budget for 2024. 
Light blue...and a Per Capita envelope!
