Happy Mother's Day

Mother's Day: Sunday, May 12, 2024

Most of us tend to think of Mother's Day as a "*Hallmark*" Holiday, a day to celebrate our moms with cards, flowers, and special meals out. But Mother's Day didn't start out as a day marked by gifts and greeting cards. In 1905 Anna Jarvis's mother passed away and three years later she organized a memorial ceremony in West Virginia to honor her mother and all mothers. She sent 500 white carnations to the service and held her own memorial in Philadelphia. Over the next few years, Jarvis campaigned to have Mother's Day recognized by the federal government and in 1914 President Wilson designed the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.

The word mother is a noun which is defined as "a multi-tasking person who loves unconditionally, leads by example, and puts others before themselves". Therefore, we consider most women to be "mother's", those who share the qualities of teaching, nurturing, and in their lives

loving many others in their lives.

Please join us on Sunday, May 12 as we will be honoring all women of the church with flowers and in our time of prayer.

An Anthem of Reflection and Celebration

What do steel drums, shakers, a drum set, and a cowbell have in common? They will all accompany the choral anthem on **Sunday, May 5 at the 10am service.** The choir will offer *Kyrie from Saint Francis in the Americas A Caribbean Mass.* The Kyrie is part of the liturgy and is often the first movement of a concert mass. As we prepare for the Lord's Supper, the anthem draws us in with a slow melody in a minor key. A West African rhythm in a major key is introduced and the piece builds to a celebratory conclusion.

Following worship, pannist Gregg Charest will offer a demonstration of the instrument which has its roots in Trinidad and Tobago and then play a selection of songs he performs regularly as part of The Island Time Steel Band.




Presbyterian Women's Book Club

Hello Dunn's Corners Family

The Mission Committee has decided to partner with Dorcas International once again to support another family. In the past 3 years, our church has worked with Dorcas to help resettle 5 households: 4 families from Syria and 2 women from the Congo. On the 17th of February, mission committee members drove up to Pawtucket with household goods to set up an apartment for the incoming family of 4 from Syria: Mother, Father, and two sons ages 6 and 8.

We are currently gathering items for a new family that is arriving from the Congo in May, and we welcome anyone who would like to help. A registry with all the household items we need will be posted on the Walmart website from the 22nd of April to the 11th of May. To find it and purchase an item, look under "Any Occasion Registries" on the Walmart.com list of registries, and choose "Refugee Family #6."

The items will be delivered to our committee chairman, so there's no need to pick anything up.

In May, members from our committee will take the household items to the apartment in the Providence area. We will clean it and get it set up. If you'd like to help, talk to any mission committee member.
