But I’m not worried about the snow. I’m worried about the isolation that comes with snow and ice and winter illnesses. The loneliness that creeps in when you’re going out as little as possible.

That’s one of the many reasons I love the institution of the church. Church is primarily a place to worship God in community, but it’s also a place to fellowship and love one another.

DCCCP is excellent at both. Just turn the pages of the Scribe and find invitations to eat pancakes, play cards, read books, serve the unhoused, encourage the children to lead worship, register for a retreat, and cook soup, and compete in a jigsaw puzzle competition. This is all in addition to your personal invitation from me to come to worship on Sunday mornings!

Please mark your calendars now, because on Sunday, Feb 8th, we will have a single service at 9 a.m. and our annual congregational meeting will follow. Then, we will have an Ash Wednesday service at 7 p.m. on February 18th to begin our Lenten season.

There are so many opportunities to be with others and fight against the isolation and loneliness of winter. We welcome you to any and all activities, and it would always be great to invite a friend who is looking for a special church community like ours.

Sesson

The session met on the 9th of December and began our meeting in the best way – celebrating a growing church by welcoming new members Karen and Neil Lynch, Bob & Terry Anstine and Thomas Blount.

Then, the good news continued as we approved the request to baptize Linda Griffin’s grandchildren in early 2026. We also approved a policy on children, youth and vulnerable adults’ protection, authorized by the Compliance Committee and adopted from the national Presbytery office. This will complete the required protection policies to be added to the church operations manual.

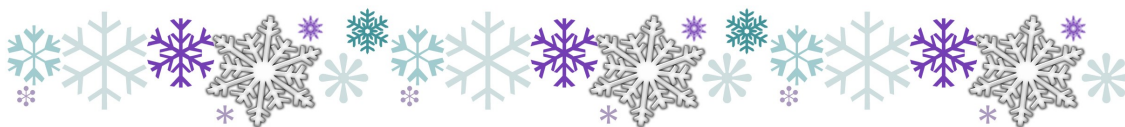
Then, we gladly accepted the request from the Impact Youth Choir from Virginia to present a concert here on June 23, 2026. This group of teenagers presented a concert several years ago and would like to return to DCCCP. Andy will coordinate their meals and overnight lodging at several church members’ homes.

With all of that positive momentum, we then centered our attention on the 2025 financial deficit and the 2026 budget. The session and trustees have gone back and forth with ideas and have settled on good recommendations about how to responsibly manage our expected income and our big plans to serve the community and worship boldly. After great discussion, the 2026 budget was passed, despite a forecasted \$17,000 deficit.

The Stewardship Committee will focus in 2026 on monthly communication of our financial status in the Scribe so please read each article as they arrive.

Conversations are happening about the potential of moving the church’s administrative offices to the Meeting House and renovating the current offices into a multipurpose meeting room that would have a larger capacity and accessibility than the Meeting House. Plans to renovate the sanctuary floor have been delayed until we can better afford it.

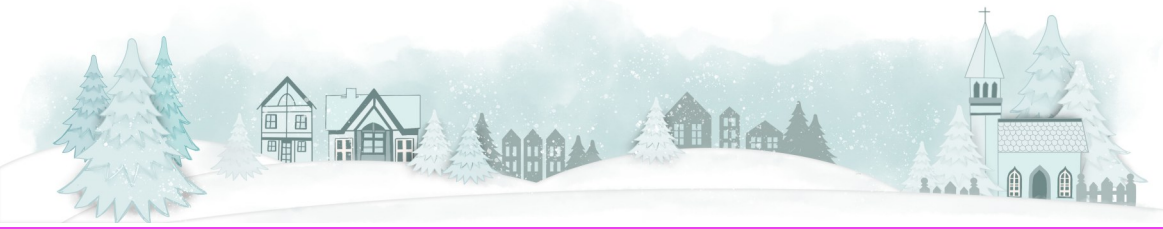

Stewardship Moment

Our Stewardship 2026 campaign has ended on a high note. Overall, the campaign brought in roughly \$9,100 more than last year’s campaign. The average giving card received was roughly \$430 higher than last year’s. A blue Per Capita envelope is enclosed with this issue of The Scribe. If you are able, please send in the annual per capita fee. The fee for 2026 will be \$53 per church member, or \$106 per couple.

In Latin, Per Capita means "*by head*" or "*for each person.*" For Presbyterians, Per Capita means the per-member fee our church is charged to belong to the greater Presbyterian Church. Per capita pays for the expenses and missions of the regional and national governing bodies of the Church.

We appreciate any payments our members are able to pay. Historically, approximately one-half of the congregation pays their per capita fee. The remainder is paid from our church budget.

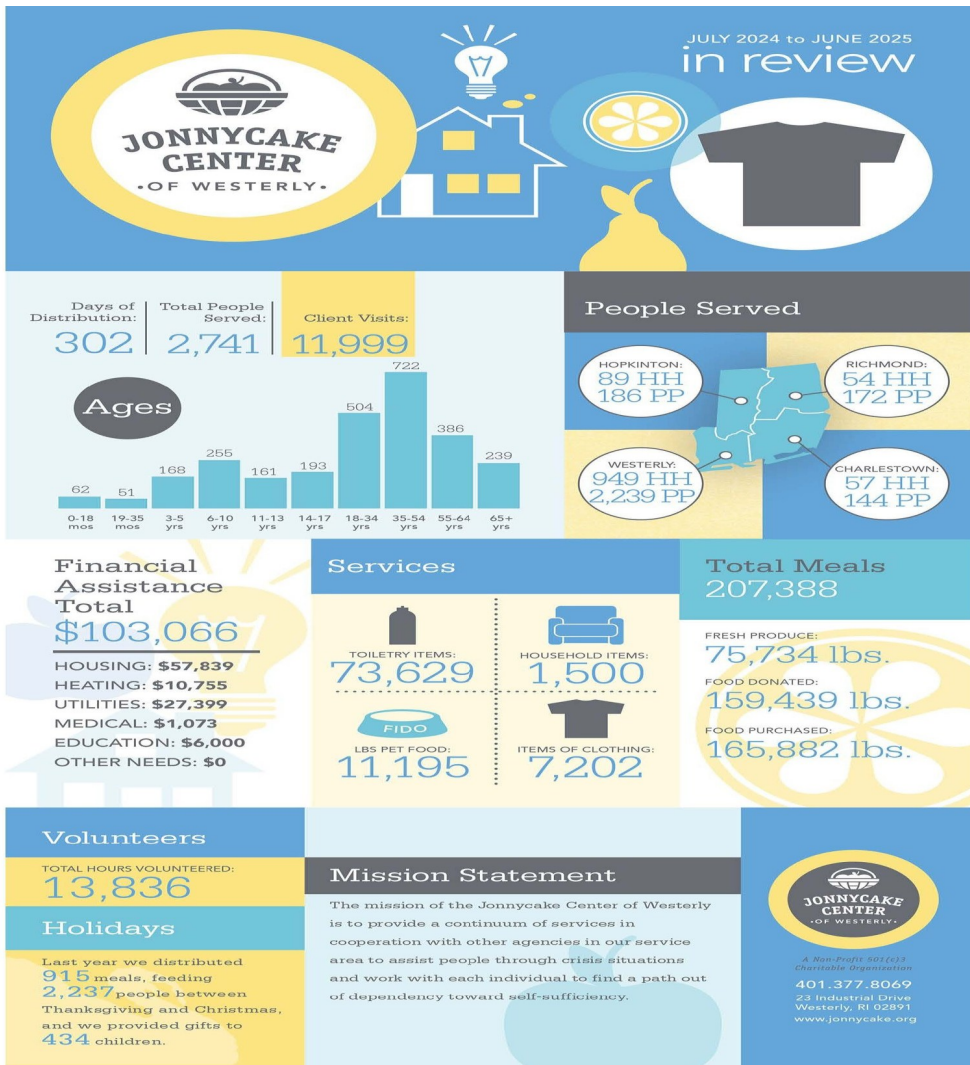

In the coming months, our children will have two wonderful Worship Arts opportunities designed to help them grow as young worshipers. In Chime Choir, the children will continue to learn how the instrument works, practice the basics of reading music, and discover what it means to play together as a team. They will prepare selections to offer in worship, helping them see that their gifts can bless the whole congregation.

The children will explore how Scripture uses images and symbols to help tell God's story and shape our faith. They will create original artwork inspired by Bible passages and themes, learning that art can be a form of prayer and praise. Their pieces will appear in worship and around the church building, reminding us that God speaks through many creative gifts, not only through words. Watch for these visual offerings in the weeks and months ahead, and remember to encourage and thank our young artists.


