## Missions Headlines

What a successful week we had in May on the Habitat for Humanity project in Westerly. Church member Jerry Wolstencroft worked with student construction volunteers from Western Kentucky University. South County Habitat asked the Mission Committee to host these hardworking students and their Mechanical Engineering professor for the week. Pastor Gin provided dinner for the group on May 12. The Kentucky crew worked at the duplex on Ledward Avenue, Westerly, which is progressing nicely. Church volunteers worked with the students on Friday, May 15.

**Future work days are scheduled on June 6th and July 11th.** DCCCP is "sponsoring" the build on July 11th, which allows us to publicize our work there to a greater degree. Please consider volunteering on these dates. Many hands are needed. All skill levels are welcome. To receive emails containing a link to a Habitat-required registration site for each upcoming church build, please provide your contact info on the signup sheet in Fellowship Hall, if you haven't already done so. **Let's have the most volunteers ever!**

We are focusing on local homelessness, and Habitat certainly addresses that. In addition, we continue our support of Westerly school students, especially those without housing. We will also begin partnering with Chariho Middle School to provide necessary goods for students in need. At our next Mission meeting in early June the committee will meet with Chariho teacher Jen Fyrer to map out a plan of action. The need is increasing. # BUILDING & GROUNDS Update



**The Building and Grounds Committee would like to update you on several projects currently in progress:**

- **Sanctuary Floor Repair**

The area where the original church building meets the newer sanctuary floor has become uneven and poses a potential tripping hazard. Repairs have been scheduled with Pucci's Carpet and will take place early this summer.

- **Sanctuary Carpet Cleaning**

Our sanctuary carpets, pew cushions, and chairs will be professionally cleaned July 20–22 by Wash Company Carpet Cleaning, an eco-friendly provider. Church members are eligible for a 15% discount—please contact them directly at 401-391-6206 for more information.

- **Office Relocation**

Over the summer, the Pastor, Office Manager, and Music Director will relocate their offices to the Meeting House. The church office will be transformed into a dedicated classroom space for children.

- **Fellowship Hall Renovations**

Initial planning is underway to convert part of the Fellowship Hall storage area into a welcoming parlor and meeting room.

- **Landscaping Improvements**

We are grateful to Broadview Florist and Garden Center for donating new landscaping in front of the Meeting House. In addition, Robyn and Ed Generali have generously supported further enhancements to the Peace Pole Island.

- **Parking Lot Improvements**

The committee is currently seeking estimates to reseal and reline the parking lot. Winter weather has caused cracking, and it has been some time since major maintenance has been completed.

- **New Walking Trail**

Plans are in place for a new walking trail that will connect key areas of our campus. The path will begin at the lower parking lot, pass behind the Memorial Garden and ELC play area, continue toward the Meeting House, wind through the woods behind the Chapel, and connect to the upper parking lot near the sandbox. Construction is anticipated early this summer.

**As you can see, many meaningful improvements are in progress. These projects represent an investment in the safety, accessibility, and beauty of our church as we continue to grow together.**

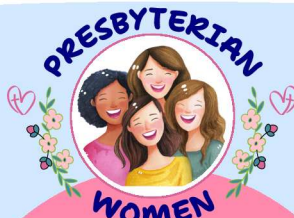

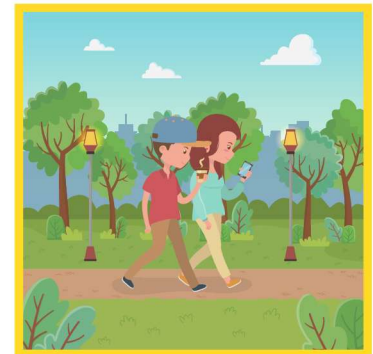


### Church Picnic

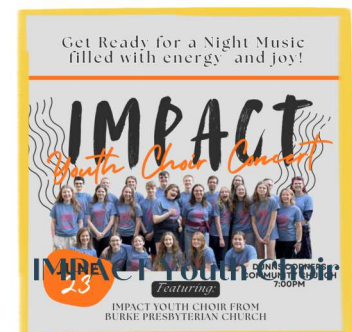
### Robyn's Walk for Cancer
