Thank you to all who helped make Lent and Easter so special this year! The Tuesday night Lenten Soup Suppers were a success. People enjoyed a hearty meal and fellowship. Over 60 children participated in the Easter Egg hunt. Pastor Gin led us through Holy Week with moving Maundy Thursday and Easter services. Andy and Kathy provided beautiful music! Thanks to the Worship Committee and others for the behind the scenes work.

We encourage you to be involved with the life of the church! Upcoming events include the **Spring Clean Up on May 2**, the **Teen Confirmation Retreat on May 8-9**, and a **Beach Clean Up on May 30**. **Children's Chimes Choir** has also begun, and plans are underway for a **June 14** church picnic following a single service.

Committees continue to advance important work within our congregation and community. Building & Grounds is moving forward with landscaping improve-

ments, sanctuary repairs, and initiatives like the "Buy a Brick" fundraiser to support Fellowship Hall updates. The Mission Committee is preparing to host a Kentucky Habitat group, supporting a June 6 build day, and continuing outreach efforts with local schools and refugee support organizations. Christian Education is preparing for Vacation Bible School in July, while also supporting youth participation in a summer retreat.

Our worship life remains vibrant, with upcoming events including **Earth Care Sunday on May 31** and the opening of **Chapel in the Pines on June 21**. The Early Learning Center and KidKare programs report steady enrollment and strong program reviews, along with continued improvements to their facilities. We are grateful for the many ways our congregation continues to live out its mission, and we look forward to all that lies ahead in the coming months.

Missions Headlines

At our April meeting, Habitat for Humanity was the main focus. We discussed arrangements for the 6-10 West Kentucky University students who will be visiting Westerly from May 11-15 to work on the house on Ledyard Ave. The committee also decided to sponsor a full Habitat build day for \$5,000, which includes \$1,765 donated by the congregation for the Easter Mission offering.

The Mission Committee plans to purchase tools for the two new Ledyard Avenue homeowners, with a projected cost of \$275 per homeowner. This is several months away.

The committee also recently purchased \$285 in toiletry items, which were delivered to the Dorcas Foundation in Providence. Dorcas helps recent refugees as they find jobs, learn English and transition to new lives in the United States.

Significant progress has been made on the construction of the duplex home on Ledward Avenue in Westerly since January, even through the snow and cold temperatures. All of the exterior walls are up, the roof sheathing is in place, and interior walls are almost completely framed. Chariho tech students have built and installed the stairs to the second floor of each unit. Soon, roof shingling will be completed and exterior siding will commence. The DCCCP Habitat volunteer construction team worked on March 6th with the largest number of volunteers in many years. The team is scheduled to work again on Saturday, June 6th and on Saturday, July 11th to help move the duplex towards completion.

The DCCCP mission committee has agreed to sponsor an Adopt-A-Day build on July 11th as well as fund a bucket of tools for each homeowner. For the Adopt-A-Day build, DCCCP may be allowed to have 15 to 20 volunteers which is double our usual allotment. So, save this specific date, July 11th, and please consider volunteering your time even if your construction skills may be limited. If you haven't already done so, sign up on the list in Fellowship Hall to receive additional information about each upcoming build date. Additionally, SCHH has asked DCCCP to cohost a group of student construction volunteers from Western Kentucky University who will be arriving on May 11th. These students and a professor will be working on the Ledward Avenue duplex from May 12th to May 15th.

Lodging has been donated by Sam Pierson, the son of church members Sam & Rachel Pierson. The mission committee has agreed to provide breakfast and snack food items and is considering a dinner with the students. A joint build day between the WKU and DCCCP construction teams is scheduled on Friday May 15th. If anyone is not comfortable with their construction skills but interested in providing snacks for the volunteers, they should stop by just before 10:00 for the daily coffee break. Sara Wait, SCHH Director of Philanthropy, has in the last couple of days, agreed to speak at DCCCP at both May 3rd services to talk about the Adopt-A-Day sponsorship and hosting the WKU students.

While still working on Ledward Avenue, ground breaking for three modular homes in Peace Dale is scheduled to begin in mid-May. After that, 10 affordable duplex homes similar to the Ledward Avenue home are planned on SCHH property off Ross Hill Road in Charlestown. Twenty-two homes in Westerly's Robin Hills neighborhood are also planned but have been delayed due to legal issues.

Thank you to the congregation for your donations to the Easter Special Mission Offering. Those gifts will help sponsor our June 6th Adopt-A-Day build. The generous support of this congregation is appreciated.
